How did I get to be 40 & other atrocities by
Judith Viorst was originally published in 1973.
Same as Whitman, Judith's poetry still rings
true 50 years later. Male or female, you will feel
something in her poetry when you read it.

Other Words for Home by Jasmine Warga
Follow Jude and her mother as they move from
Syria to the United States to live with Jude's uncle's
family. Over time Jude gains confidence and makes
new friends but not without some hiccups along
the way.

Full Cicada Moon by Marilyn Hilton
This historical fiction novel in verse follows halfBlack, half-Japanese Mimi after her family moves to
a new town. As she struggles to fit in and make
friends in a town where almost everyone looks
differently from her, we go along for the ride with
the lyrical poems that tell the story from Mimi's
perspective.



writers.






Children's Poetry Books
