October: Fall Fun!



Genealogy and Local History



Looking at the old school bell from the Como School will remind many of you who have contributed memories and photos of Whiteside County schools. Whiteside County Genealogists have been documenting all rural schools from twenty-two townships. So much of this information was being collected and entered on a jump drive by Donald Mulnix with the hope that in the next few months we would have a publication for sale of Whiteside rural schools. Much of that material was collected by the Sterling Public Library and turned over to Don.

Don Mulnix passed away recently, but two of our members have stepped up to continue collecting material. The book will be finished and dedicated to Don. In the meantime, if anyone has any more information to be used in the book, please drop it off or call Marilyn at 625-1370, extension 20.

Don was involved in three publications the genealogy society published in recent years and placed in the library genealogy and local history collections. A few of these publications are still for sale. One publication is titled "Whiteside County, Illinois History and Families" which focuses on the county's history from 1839 to 2013. The other names all of Whiteside County's Civil War veterans that we could find, what unit they served and where they are buried.

Annual Cemetery Walk

Our next big project will be our annual cemetery walk at Riverside Cemetery to be held on Sunday, September 16th, 2018. Tours will begin at 1:30 PM. Dress comfortably and put on your walking shoes!

This year with the 200th birthday of the state of Illinois to be celebrated on December 3rd, we will be portraying and telling the stories of the first settler's of Sterling, many of whom will be having their 200th birthday about the same time of the state's celebration. We will have portrayers telling the story of Hezekiah Brink the first settler in Sterling who was born the 21st of May 1809. Hezekiah was our first settler and arrived in 1834. Hezikiah has many descendants, and they have visited Sterling many times.

We will have a horse and buggy on the grounds for anyone who would like to ride around the cemetery. A bag-piper will be on hand to finish the cemetery walk. Many more stories will be told. More information on the cemetery walk will be available on the library website soon.

Director's Corner-Jennifer Slaney

There are many exciting things happening at the library. First off, THANK YOU to the volunteers that passed out 1,100 lunches at the library for Feed the Children. Good Job!

I'm proud to announce that the library purchased two passes to the Putman Museum in Davenport. The passes are available to current adult resident library card holders. The pass allows for up to five people to the museum. It does not include admission to the Putman IMAX theater. There is a \$20 refundable deposit. It is due back in three days. The library will have the passes available for a year.

Did you by chance get a Kindle? If you haven't logged on to the library website or maybe you have, you might have noticed a little tab on the right entitled Tutorials. The library now offers Niche Academy, a tutorial based application that provides a video on how to load an e-book onto your device. Of course, it also has videos on how to use Facebook, Twitter and Snapchat-if you always wondered how to get started on these popular apps.

For the local authors of our community, the library started a new service called BiblioBoard Library. It works similar to Overdrive or Axis360 in that it lets you download e-book and audiobooks to your device. However, where OverDrive/ Axis360 focus on popular fiction and nonfiction, Biblioboard focuses on indie authors. It's a great way for self-published authors to get their books into libraries (across Illinois) and to make sure their work is discovered by our patrons. The biggest difference is that BiblioBoard library has two very useful add-ons (Pressbook and Self-E) that help authors format their e-books (for free) and submit them to the Indie Illinois Collection. In other words, you use Pressbooks to create your e-book—either writing into the editor or uploading the finished files. Then you can use Self-E to share it with the rest of Illinois. Books submitted to Self-E are even reviewed by Library Journal. The best of them are featured in indie collections all over the United States. Check it out on the library's webpage under the digital library tab. If you or somebody you know is an author watch the library's webpage and Facebook page for training seminars coming this fall.

I am happy to announce that the library will be hosting its second annual Author's Fair on Saturday, December 1, 2018 from 10:00 AM-2:00 PM. This fair gives local authors an opportunity to display their work and to network with the public and other authors. Authors must register to take part in this event. There will be no Fall 2018 Used Book Sale

At this time we do not have enough books to make a good sale. We will have a sale in early April 2019. Sorry for any inconvenience this may cause.

We do take donations but we do have guidelines that we ask that you follow. The guidelines are as follows:

- We do not take Reader's Digest books, textbooks, dictionaries or encyclopedias of any type
- We do not take multiple copies of one title
- Do not take VHS tapes
- Do not take music cassettes
- Audio books must also have a publication date of 2013 or newer
- Local authors' donations must be approved by the library director
- Books must have a publication date of 2013 or newer-this is all books-children's, adult and young adult-fiction and nonfiction
- DVDs must have a release date of 2013 or newer
- Music CDs must have a release date of 2013 or newer

We do not just take books when people want to just drop them off. We ask that you respect these guidelines. Please sort through your donations to be sure they match our guidelines. When our book sales are over we have to find a place for what is left. Self Help Enterprises will take books to recycle and some of the resale shops will take all of the above.
