

Genealogy and Local History

In the United States a nation-wide census has been taken every ten years since 1790. One of the easiest ways to locate where an ancestor lived and when they lived there is to use www.census-online.com.




The first census to name the whole family is the 1850 census. Before 1850 it only names the head of the household. The 1840 census told if you were a pensioner of the Revolutionary War or military service. From 1790 to 1860 there were slave schedules. But, until 1870 the slaves were nameless. The 1870 census is the first census where those nameless persons on the slave schedules were free and are listed by name and age. The war had liberated nearly four million slaves. The 1870 census will be continued in the next newsletter as it contains so many details of the census schedule after the Civil War.

County courthouses have a wide range of information. When doing research one should search every available document in the courthouse from purchasing, transferring of slaves, wills, to help reconstruct the family. Finding African American families when they changed surnames between 1865 and 1875 was common. Many African American families choose a different surname when they were freed. If you suspect this happened in your family, try searching on the first name and ages to locate the family or searching on the neighbor's surnames.

If you are searching Whiteside County, you can search in the Genealogy/Local History department in the Sterling Public Library. We have the census records for Whiteside County from 1840 to 1940.

The latest searchable census is 1940 because the United States has a "72-year rule" that restricts access to census records to all but the individual named on the record or their legal heir. Therefore, the 1930 census was released in 2002, the 1940 in April 2012. The 1950 census will not be released until April, 2022.



February is Black History Month. Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing the central role of blacks in U.S. history. You can check out the book, "Black Genealogy" from the Genealogy/Local History department. Other related books are available throughout the library.





Wednesday March 7, 2018 from 9–11:00 AM a Master Gardener will be in the main lobby of the library to answer your gardening questions.




They will also be doing a S.T.E.A.M. program this summer during the Children's Summer Reading Program. Please take advantage of these opportunities.
















"Creative Wednesday"
