# Our Carnegie Library Is 116 Years Young! It needs a "little" maintenance to return to its best. You can help!

This past summer, the library board authorized repairs to the two flat portions of the library roof, gutters, and some tuck-pointing of bricks. As the contractor began the process of replacing a portion of copper flashing, it was discovered that the decorative copper cornice anchors and seams have disintegrated - along with the wood supports intended to secure the cornice to the wall. The original project was halted to address this newly discovered issue, and to ensure the project is completed correctly. The library board has now received an estimate of \$200,000 to complete the additional work.

Please be a part of this project! Our library is the heart of Sterling! Its grand architecture is adorned by the beautiful weathered copper dentil moldings which have graced this important building since its beginning. When these repairs are complete, the board is hopeful that the library's once-persistent water problems have finally been solved and this repair will hold for another one hundred years.

The board would like to raise \$50,000 through private donations. Donation jars will be at the circulation desks upstairs and downstairs. Any amount is appreciated! Bills, coins....
