


Reading with Therapy Dogs





Code Name Blue Wren by Jim Popkin is a true historical account of one of the most damaging spies in U.S. History. She operated in Miami for 17+ years as a double agent for Fidel Castro and Cuba.





The Little Wartime Library by Kate Thompson is historical fiction about a female librarian in 1944 London keeping people safe in the only tube station turned library. There's more to the story, but you'll have to check it out to find out what.

Princess Academy by Shannon Hale
In this fantasy novel with a magical setting, Miri
must decide between the boy she cares for and her
family's future when it is announced that a girl from
her mountain village will be chosen to be the next
princess.

Maybe He Just Likes You by Barbara Dee
Here we follow the inner thoughts of Mila, a 7th
grader who would much rather focus on her love of
the trumpet than on the boys in her grade who
harass her and give her unwanted attention. By the
end of the novel, Mila finds support from her
bandmates and stands up for herself. Available


